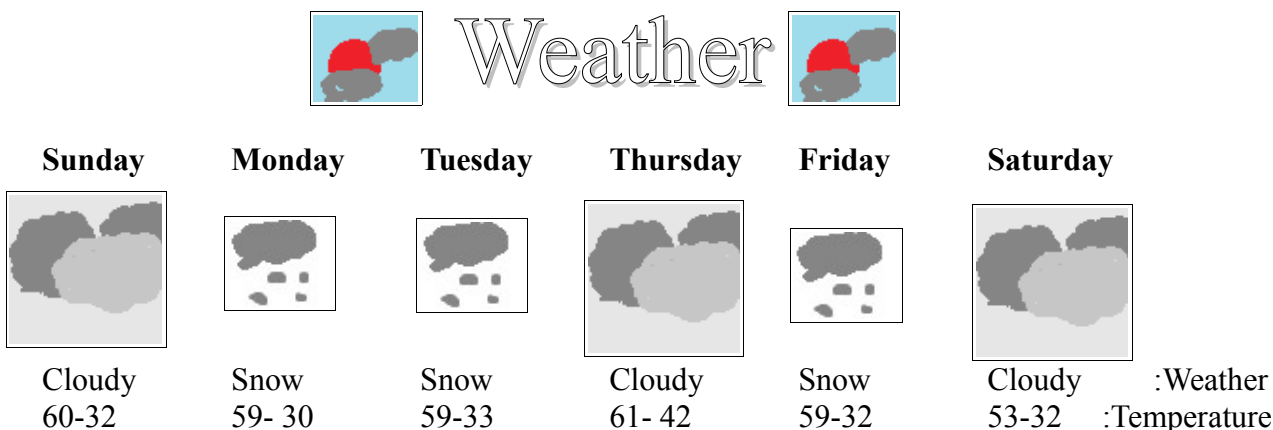
Ambassadors

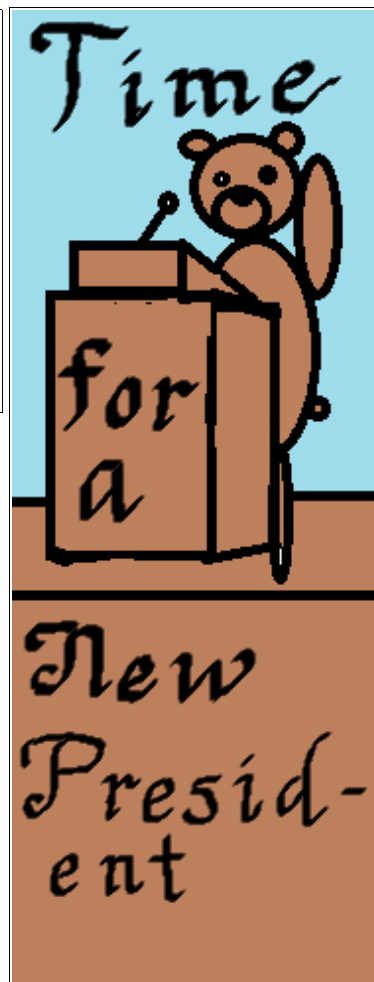

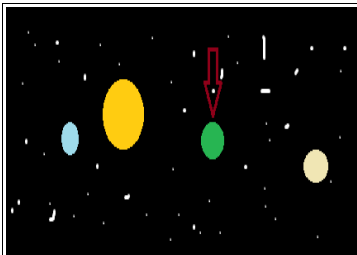
Russia Brings up a Plan

Menito [Men- eat-oh] Kutufft [Kut-off-t] replied on the 6 that he was just giving an idea and that the world nation would be run by ambassadors.

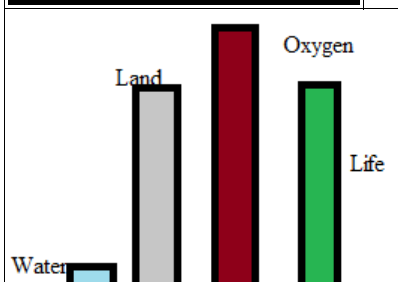
The issue died down on the 15, but is a major topic in Animalzanian grocery shops [the main political talking place].

For those who would soon bring out their fruit.

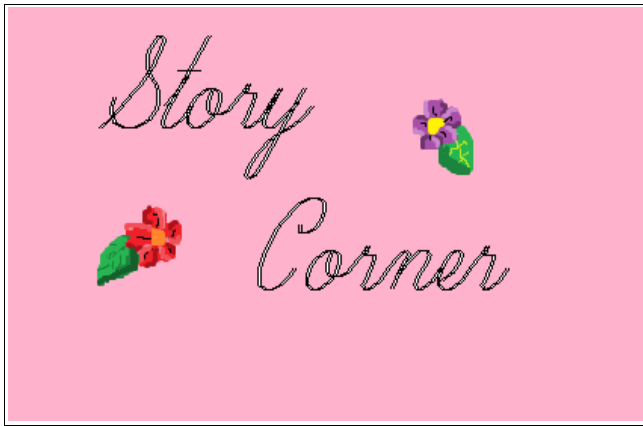
“A Pleasant Nook”
